### What is SICAP

The Social Inclusion Community and Activation Programme (SICAP) is a government programme. Galway Rural Development (GRD) manage it in County Galway. We give funding and support to help fight poverty and social exclusion. We work with local communities, disadvantaged people, community groups, and government agencies.

### What we do

We help those who are most in need of support to access training, employment and education. We also help and support Local Community Groups.

### How we support you

On a one-to-one basis we can help you to:

- improve your own life
- get a job,
- set up a business or social enterprise,
- take part in education,
- build your self-confidence,
- take part in your local community.

We work with your Local Community Groups to make them:

- stronger
- better able to address their own needs and support their community.

## You can benefit from SICAP if you:

- Are unemployed
- Belong to the Traveller or Roma community
- Are a one-parent family
- Have a disability
- Live in an area that is rural or less well off
- Are a migrant, refugee or asylum seeker
- Or your family are living on low income
- Are a young person looking for a job or training
- Are a low income farmer or retired

## Start your own Business supports

Ilf you are not working and would like to set up your own business, our Enterprise Officer can help you.

We offer a range of supports and can help you apply for the Back to Work Enterprise Allowance What is the Back to Work Enterprise Allowance?

The Back to Work Enterprise Allowance helps you if you are unemployed and want to set up your own business. It helps you to develop your business while you keep an enterprise support payment. This payment will reduce over two years while you set up your business.

### Who runs the Back to Work Enterprise Allowance?

The Department of Social Protection runs the scheme through Intreo.

We will help you to access the scheme. We can help you prepare applications and provide business training.

### How do you apply for the Back to Work Enterprise Allowance?

You need to go through a process called the "assessment of suitability" with Intreo (DSP). This helps decide if you can apply. If you are successful, you must also do our Start Your Own Business course. We will help you send your final application to the Department of Social Protection.

## Many award wins for Healthy Islands project

'Healthy Islands' is the name of a project organised by SICAP and Healthy County Galway. It brought service providers to the offshore Islands in County Galway Inis Mór, Inis Oírr, Inis Meáin and Inisbofin. The events focused on health and well-being.

They helped show what help is available to the people living on the Islands. They also helped to build connections for future projects in some of the most remote parts of the county. It won an award "Age Friendly Active and Healthy Aging Award" at the National Age Friendly Awards. It also won the "Best Community Health Award" at the All Ireland Community and Council awards.

These were for the work carried out by all the groups involved including the hard working coops. on the Islands. The groups brought skills and resources together. They shared information that can help create healthier communities. Thanks to all the groups that helped make these events so successful. Thanks also to the Islanders for their warm welcome.

### Make the Link

There was another very successful "Make the Link" roadshow in Autumn. It provided information to help people looking for a job, education or training. SICAP organised this with the Galway and Roscommon Education and Training Board (GRETB) and the Department of Social Protection (DSP). This free event took place in Tuam, Ballinasloe, Cliften and Gort.
